- have coherent strategies for working with schools causing concern, and those facing a shortage/hard to fill/specialist subject areas.
- have strategies to respond to the changing patterns of supply needs in schools have a supply workforce that is representative of the population served by schools
- offer an out of hours service to schools
- have a planned comprehensive Continuous Professional Development programme for all supply staff

The agencies on the framework contract will also break down the charges to you as part of a drive to increase transparency. Schools can be assured that the administration charges levied by the new framework agencies will not exceed £37 per day.

Traded Services Survey

The Traded Services Forum agreed at the February meeting to raise the acceptable performance standard required of internal and external providers. Previously the Forum has accepted *highly satisfactory* as the minimum standard but from the 2012 / 2013 survey the Forum will only accept a minimum standard of *good*. Providers currently in the *highly satisfactory* category have received a letter explaining that over the course of the next two years the Forum expects progress towards and entry into the *good* performance category. We hope that this will raise performance standards higher than ever.

Battery Recycling

Many schools have already taken part in battery recycling. We are pleased to report that Leeds City Council has been pleased so far with the response they have received city wide. We are appealing to schools to get involved in this initiative by encouraging parents and other schools to take part. At the last count, the schools that have recycled the most are Alwoodley Primary School, Gildersome Primary School, Pudsey Bolton Royd Primary School and Queensway Primary School with 18kg each. Taxi's and Private Hire Framework Contract

Most schools will use taxi's and private hire companies to transport children around the city. Leeds City Council has a framework contract for passenger transport services for children and vulnerable adults. Your school may already be using this contract having run a competition exercise with the assistance of Leeds City Council Passenger Services. Schools should note that every licensed taxi driver in Leeds has been subject to a full enhanced CRB check. Collaborative Procurement

Many schools have been asking about the benefits of joining together to procure goods and services to achieve better value. This, in principle, is a very good idea as better economies of scale can be achieved by aggregating the expenditure of multiple schools. Fresh Pastures CIC – Recycle Art

Did you know of some of the added value that Fresh Pastures can bring to your school as part of the Leeds City Council milk contract? Fresh Pastures have a dedicated Education Projects Co-ordinator, Anne Dixon, who can deliver Recycle_Art workshops and assemblies, by arrangement, at no cost to the school. The workshops are usually of half day duration, certain workshops can take a full day.

Anne told us; *'The 3R's (reduce/reuse/recycling) work within this project is linked with Healthy Schools, environment through citizenship and PSHCE. The model making adds enrichment and supports a variety of curriculum themes. We want the children to drink ALL their milk – with the empty carton as an added bonus to make a model with! As a school milk supplier we can of course talk to children about the journey their milk has taken from the cows to the carton!'*
